But he returned to his roots in New Orleans to study music at the University of New Orleans, which was under the direction of Ellis Marsallis. He studied and jammed with such jazz greats as Steve Masakowski, Victor Goines, Harold Battiste, and Yed Peterson.

Paul now lives in Cabo San Lucas, and has played jazz with the group Adamaha at the Office on Medano Beach for the last three years.

Paul will be entertaining you with his jazz guitar sounds from the 6 to 9 dinner hour Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Sunday.

Sexto Sentido

It could be said that Sexto Sentido, (Sixth Sense in Spanish), specializes in diversity. They represent the musical techniques and cultural styles of diverse musicians that make up their group to forge a unique performing energy.

At the core of this group are Norma Sanchez, a Mexican, sings in three languages, and New Yorker Howard Clifton plays the saxophones, keyboards, arranges, and is the musical director. On any given night, they might have three or four like minded musicians sitting in.

Their music includes bolero, Cuban, and cha cha cha, as well as jazz and blues, Latin jazz fusions, la cumbia, samba, bossa nova and reggae from Brazil.

You'll hear them play some of your favorites, such as cha cha from Stevie Wonder, blues from John Coltrane, bolero and samba from Santana, and Billy Holiday style jazz.
